there and they looked after me. Hilary has been very kind with me and I enjoyed her food. I gained two kilos, which was marvellous because I am thin. The first day in the centre, I was a little bit stressed, some people explained to me what to do, as I did not know really how to manage with the children but after a few days, it was better and better and a great experience, I think I had a good relationship with the children, they were great. And the team was also great and always there when necessary. I learnt a lot with the children and would be able to do it again. I really like England, I feel people are more polite and respectful than in France. Many thanks to all the people who made that happen.
