#### 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Visit to Eschweiler - Thurs 19 June -Sun 22 June 2025

Wow! Can't believe that next year it will be 40 years of friendship between us - despite everything! We can all be really proud of this. We have been invited to Eschweiler to celebrate although the arrangements are still to be made. This will take some time so it would be really useful if you would make a note of the date and let me know if you might be interested in coming (without any commitment at this stage). The aim would be to travel by (large!) coach but this depends on numbers. Accommodation could be hotel or with families. There have been many people involved with the link over the years but before I contact anyone else I should like to ask current Twinners. So to avoid later disappointment, please let me know if you might consider coming, together with your preferences for travel/accommodation.

#### Eschweiler Karneval 2024

Another unforgettable occasion! It is so difficult to describe Karneval; the street parades or the inside performances. There are a lot of videos on the Internet - if you search for "Eschweiler Karneval 2024" you will have a better idea of what goes on. They can't possibly recreate the lovely atmosphere though, of everyone having a great time together. The idea is that Karneval brings everyone together, no matter who they are or what their personal situation is, and that no-one should have to celebrate alone. Definitely what the world needs at the moment - even if it is just for a few days. People have always been so friendly to us - we arrived on Friday evening at the Festival Hall in Duerwiss and as soon as we got through the door we were overwhelmed by greetings. Eventually we were released to enjoy a wonderful evening of music, singing, jokes and dancing.

There are 22 Karneval groups in Eschweiler, each with their own coloured uniform, band and dancers. Historically we have always linked with the Narrengarde in Duerwiss (blue and yellow) and more recently with KG Ulk (blue and red). These groups in particular have been especially welcoming to us.

On Saturday morning, representatives dressed in Karneval clothes from all the groups are greeted in the Town Hall with a beer (or soft drink) by the Mayor Nadine Leonhardt and the Chairman of the Karneval Committee. Such a colourful spectacle!! There are a few speeches followed by a bit more music and dancing, before leaving for lunch. In the evening we were invited to the KG Ulk group's session. Our host Heinz-Michael Raby has just retired from being President but we congratulated his successor and really enjoyed the evening's entertainment, mostly from the group's own members.

Karneval Sunday, the Mayor invites the Karneval Prince and some members of his group, together with the Karneval Committee and "visitors" - us and some of our friends from Eschweiler's French twin town Wattrelos -for breakfast. There are a few presentations, especially to the little Pages who accompany the Prince during six weeks of office. Then we rush back to Duerwiss to change clothes and prepare for their street procession in the afternoon. As it's a smaller neighbourhood just outside Eschweiler, quite a lot of

people there know us and are keen to collect our annual Karneval badges, with several displaying a whole scarf full from previous years. We once again joined the Narrengarde officers on one of their floats, to distribute our sweets and give-aways to the crowds lining the streets. After a couple of hours of singing and shouting greetings to the crowds we were glad to return to the Festival Hall for a couple of beers, to meet the other participants and await the arrival of the Karneval Prince and his entourage before returning "home" for a slightly earlier night.

The Monday of the Roses street parade is the main event, and celebrated in Eschweiler much as in Cologne, but in a more local way without political themes. All 22 Karneval groups have several floats each for their band/s, children, officers etc, pulled by tractors and joined by the walking groups. Precisely at noon the Karneval sets off with the first groups around the crowd-lined streets waiting for the "goodies" thrown from floats. The tour lasts around four hours. According to the local Press, there were 6000 participants this year and 200,000 spectators, making it once again the third largest Karneval in Germany. We were invited to a Schnitzel Buffet in a local pub afterwards with the KG Ulk group and it was nice to have the time to chat to some of them afterwards.

Another great Karneval was over. We met lots of people who were all really appreciative that we were there to support their Karneval. Thanks to everyone, especially our hosts the Raby Family, for a great time.

The 2023 accounts are with the auditor and showed a net income of £900+ for the year and a healthy bank balance which will be needed for the forthcoming anniversary visit by Brunoy. Main events - the quiz earned £1045 and visits by twin clubs cost £606

The 2024 accounts to date show a net income of over £2000 which has been boosted by the recent quiz which raised over £900 including raffle receipts over £300. Also our savings account has yielded good interest with the increase of bank rates. Cash at the bank is currently therefore at a high level in anticipation of the Brunoy visit and other expected expenses during the year. Membership income is down £80 on last year
